



FASD United empowers people living with FASD and prenatal substance exposure to educate systems of care and the public, enact policies, and unite communities everywhere.

All of our work — every program and every project — is intentionally designed to fit this structure and align with these priorities. This is also how we measure and understand our needs as an organization.

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FASD United Programs



The Family Navigator program is a zero-barrier national resource where individuals, families, and professionals can call to find local resources. Navigators provide personalized one-on-one peer support, referrals to vetted resources and services, and assistance with medical, educational, and disability benefits.



The Resource Directory offers 1,200 professionally vetted FASD resources for all 50 states. An interactive map can be found on our website that links to informative pdf documents with state-specific information.



The FASD Affiliate Network is a group of 47 autonomous organizations united to further FASD awareness, provide support and improve the quality of life for those affected by prenatal alcohol exposure.



Our Media and Communications Hub distributes information on FASD and PAE nationally through our websites, Weekly Round-up newsletter, and social media platforms.

FASD United Programs



A 2-step virtual support group offering a peermentorship network for people who consumed substances during pregnancy and may have a child with FASD. This group also completes grand rounds presentations in partnership with the American College of Obstetricians.



The Policy and Training Center works to achieve public policy outcomes on behalf of individuals living with FASD and to train stakeholders to participate effectively in the pursuit of policy objectives. Legislative meetings take place throughout the year.



Our Justice Center addresses issues surrounding FASD and the justice system, including meetings of the FASD Justice Task Force.

2024IMPACT



FASD United brought back the international FASD Research Conference in Seattle, Washington, attracting nearly 600 attendees from 28 different countries.

Our <u>Family Navigators</u> hit a record of supporting over 1,000 calls for resources from individuals and families looking for support.





The FASD Respect Act passed the <u>Senate HELP</u>
<u>Committee</u> (Health Education Labor and Pensions)
for the first time in 20 years!

Our <u>Affiliate Network</u> has gained 7 new member organizations, for a total of **48 total** affiliates!





The FASD United team collected the data and published <u>50 State Data</u> sheets on policies statistics in each US state.

We maintained our <u>Platinum Seal of Transparency</u> through GuideStar by Candid, showcasing our credibility as a national organization.
